The *Paul Cardall Scholarship for Students Affected by CHD* was established in 2010 by SLCC alumnus Paul Cardall, who was born with a complex congenital heart defect and received a heart transplant on 09-09-09. The costs associated with a chronic illness such as Congenital Heart Disease (CHD) are understandably high. Mr. Cardall wishes to help those who have been affected by CHD to obtain an education at SLCC.

This scholarship is available to residents of the Rocky Mountain Region who either have CHD or whose immediate family members have been diagnosed with CHD. Applicants must have a sincere desire to continue their education and the capacity to do well in college. Successful applicants will demonstrate courage and character in their response to the challenge of CHD.

This \$3,000 tuition scholarship (\$1,500 per semester) will be awarded in mid February for the following Fall and Spring Semesters.

- Applicant must be admitted to SLCC
- Must enroll for at least 9 hours but not more than 18 hours in a degree or certificate program of the applicant's choice
- Attach a copy of your most recent high school or college transcript
- Demonstrate need by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form for 2010-11 and have the results sent to Salt Lake Community College
- Attach a 1-page essay (typed, 12 pt font, double spaced) discussing the reasons you should be considered for a one-year tuition scholarship to SLCC. Please include the following information in your essay:
 - A description of your experience with congenital heart disease and an explanation of how this has influenced your life and those who love you
 - Mention your accomplishments (i.e., service projects, community involvement, volunteer work, clubs and organizations, honors and recognition, etc.)
 - What are your future goals, hopes or dreams?

Application Deadline: February 10, 2010. Applications received after the deadline cannot be considered.
